Who advances: Top 5 teams, top 7 individuals not on those teams and any individual in the top 10 to the Nov. 8 state meet at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

Class 1A

Elmwood Sectional

When: Saturday at Maple Lane Country Club — Girls, 10:30 a.m.; Boys, 11:15 a.m.

Area boys teams: Tremont, Olympia, El Paso-Gridley, Illini Central, Heyworth, Central Catholic, Deer Creek-Mackinaw, Clinton.

Area boys individuals: Tommy Standish, Eureka; Brayden Batterton, Delavan.

Area girls teams: Eureka, Central Catholic, Heyworth, Deer Creek-Mackinaw, Olympia.

Area girls individuals: Abbey Green, Delavan; Brianna Anello, Delavan, Maddie Morrison, El Paso-Gridley; Millie White, Clinton.

FYI: Based on the Dyestat state rankings, the expected boys state qualifiers from here are No. 3 Elmwood, No. 10 Rochester, No. 12 Pleasant Plains, No. 14 Tremont and No. 22 Macomb. For the girls, No. 2 Petersburg Porta, No. 4 Rochester, No. 10 Rock Island Alleman, No. 11 Eureka and No. 14 Elmwood are expected to advance. Top area individuals include El Paso-Gridley's Hunter Cobbley for the boys and Olympia's Shelby Siltman for the girls.

FYI: Out of 11 ranked boys teams here, PBL's Nick Porter-led squad is the fifth highest ranked. The Panthers last qualified in 2007 when they placed fourth in the state. No. 1 Monticello is the favorite. The girls field boasts eight ranked teams including No. 1 St. Joseph-Ogden.

Mahomet-Seymour's Alex Keeble and Notre Dame's Maryjeanne Gilbert are top contenders individually. The Mahomet-Seymour girls are led by regional champion Lauren Whitehouse.
