Both MSHS cross country teams clinch Corn Belt titles in Eureka

Keeble shatters Corn Belt meet record dating back to 1990

The boys' cross country runners continue to set records and stay ranked as the No. 1 team in Class 2A and one of the top ten teams in the nation.

The Bulldogs scored the fewest points ever (20) to dominate the Corn Belt Conference meet hosted by Eureka High School on Saturday.

As the conference meet varsity champion, Alex Keeble shattered the Corn Belt meet record and broke the course record with a time of 14:36. Dan Nielsen set the previous meet record in 1990 with a time of 15:03.

Keeble also ran the fastest senior time ever run by a Mahomet runner at any meet in 46 years and is currently ranked in the top 50 individuals in the nation.

M-S won the conference meet for the third year in a row—their only championships since entering the Corn Belt meet in 1986.

Bulldog runners earned six of the first eight All-

M-S also won the conference open race with a score of 17 points, only two higher than the perfect score of 15.

Again, the Bulldogs placed six runners in the top ten.

Bryson Keeble, who ran the fastest for a freshman,
