ELITE EIGHT

There were lots of big sports stories this year, including a state championship for the Mahomet-Seymour dance team and a runner-up finish for boys' cross country. But no story caught the imaginations of fans quite like the boys' basketball team's trip to the Elite Eight.

After winning their first regional title in five years, they secured a sectional crown. At Prairie Capital Convention Center in Springfield, the Crusaders of Belleville Althoff Catholic ended M-S' fairytale season 79-49 in the super sectional. "Those wins weren't just for the team," Coach Chad Benedict told the Citizen's Jason Brown. "It went deep for this community."
