Ray's Take: All-State Stephen Poorten was Sycamore's lone representative in Peoria at state after a good 2015 Sycamore team finished 7th in the tough Woodstock North Sectional. Poorten is the #1 returner in the class of 2018 and NIC-Big 12 defending champ, and looks to bounce back after an inconsistent track season. Sycamore returns almost its entire team, and as a result, stand a good chance to join Poorten in Peoria. "This is our deepest team in recent years," exclaims coach Michael Lambdin. Lambdin projects that as many as 10 upperclassmen, as well as a couple freshmen, can compete for a top 7 spot on a good Spartan team.

Connor Farrell and Jake Carani lead a pack that hopes to make a charge after last year's 3rd place at NIC-Big 12. Among several others, those two can be joined by **Quinton Benzschawel**, **John Lerohl**, **Riley Melton**, **David Lerohl** or **Lucas McKay**. The depth of the Spartans can prove to be an advantage as they run a handful of deep meets that includes their home invite (Sycamore Invitational), First to the Finish, and the Rock River Run. Lambdin knows this teams potential: "We would like to improve on last year's 7th place finish at the Woodstock North Sectional hopefully resulting in an opportunity to race at the State Meet."

Ray's Take: Alleman High has shown it can compete among larger schools after the multiplier, finishing 7th at the extremely deep Normal (University) Sectional in 2015. Based on this circumstance, Alleman and coach Stoll have their sights set on the Western Big 6. Stoll: "Rock Island Alleman is a small school (1A) which has been bumped up to 2A via the success multiplier so our goal is for both teams to win their conference meet. For the boys team this would be a 6th straight Western Big 6 title. After that, we face very difficult 2A fields at the Sectional meet so we are realistic about our chances."

A state berth is not out of the conversation, however, and this is assisted by the front end strength of Augie Darrow and Spencer Smith. Other proven scorers are Ben Weaver, Brendan Hird and Connor Sheley. Some roster turnover means that Alleman will have to search for the depth to continue competing with mid-Illinois 2A programs but the Western Big 6 belongs to the Pioneers of Rock Island, Alleman.

Ray's Take: For the second year in a row, Peoria Notre Dame will be putting a very experienced team into meets this year. A big gap exists between their first three runners: Patrick Bruch -who could be all state, Mitchell Maushard, and Jade Baille are the top three Irish runners. Their pack will be determined by Tony Haddad (who ran state last year as a sophomore), John Couri and Thomas Kortz. PND is also the defending 2015 Big 12 team champ and will have to fight off the pack from Danville. Bruch enters the season as the #1 returner from the conference meet.

**Ray's Take:** Having your first runner score 1 point at most races never hurts, and that is exactly the privilege that Prairie Ridge will enjoy during **Filip Pajak's** senior year. Prairie Ridge, another strong northern Illinois team, runs against most of the top individuals in the state frequently and Pajak holds his own with the ranks of the best in Illinois- expect him to be sharp when Peoria rolls around, and do not be surprised if he wins the state title.

The Wolves are typically neck-and-neck with the other Crystal Lake schools (Central and South) and this year will prove to be the same in a race for the Fox Valley Conference now that Grayslake has vacated the conference. A very competitive team joins Pajak: Mike Ostow, James Lasak, David Tukle and Brian Dorn are a good pack with the chops to compete in the Woodstock sectional. If these runners can dip into the 15 minute range, they could take one of the five qualifying spots. Shutt: "We return a strong foundation of experienced athletes that put in a consistent summer. We need to race more aggressively and with greater confidence in order to challenge for a title."

Ray's Take: At the 2015 state meet, Danville High split's was tighter even than champion Grayslake Central's, bringing their top five in less than 43 seconds. This number could shrink in 2016 for the Vikings, who bring back five of their top eight runners in 2016. William Powell was their top scorer at state and he is joined by Phillip Hall, Sincere Williams-Davis, and Tyler Huckleberry. Danville gets an added boost from incoming freshman Michael Moreman, who finished behind only Rockford's Tristian Olpin in the IESA 1A state championship in 2015.

**Coach Todd Orvis' Take**: "We have two big goals which have been the same for us the past couple years. We want to win the Big 12 Conference title (which we haven't won since '82) and we want to be a top ten team at the state meet. I believe our team can be better than last season. We have had a solid summer of training and we should be able to make a significant improvement over last year's 13th place finish."

Says Dickerson, "We graduated a whopping 24 seniors; for a program that is lucky to get 10 freshmen out each year, that means this really is a different team culturally and they need to buy in to the same things our graduates and experienced returners did." South's team is led by 2015 St. Ignatius transfer Brett Haffner, the fifth returner in the class of 2018 for 2A. Haffner is joined from 2015's team by Chris Joseph and Trevor Schauer. After those three, the roster is young and open. Possible scorers include Trevor Lehmann and Tim Rudolph, two frosh stars from last year, and Tyler Gaytan who returns after taking 2015 off. Keep an eye out for Nick Beronio as well, a freshman without experience but with a strong summer of training, reports Dickerson. Coach Dickerson added: "As a team, we will probably be off the radar at the beginning of the season, especially compared with last year, but I think we can be vastly improved by championship season and surprise some people."

Ray's Take: Troy Yunk knows that this team is different from all the other North squads he has coached: "For the past 9 years we have always had a strong all state type front runner who can give us low points at the front of the race, but this years team will not have that and we will need to be more of a close pack team from 1-5." And now for the first year since 2006 without a Yunk on the team, the Blue Thunder look to Alec Scott and Jared Ellingson, both with multiple years of state experience, to lead Belvidere North back to Peoria. But first, they have a conference title to defend, says Coach Yunk. "We hope to be able to push Hononegah for the NIC-10 title," says Yunk. "The key for us in the NIC-10 will be our split from 1-5. If our 5th man is too far off of our first we will have trouble beating Hononegah."

For the pack mentality to work, **Jake Martocci**, **Brandt Lerma**, **Jack Macaluso** and **Austin Harnois** must improve together through the year and work closer to Ellingson and Scott. Having six runners under 16:00 is possible for the Blue Thunder but may not be enough to make an impact at state without a frontrunner. Still, North looks strong and will continue to be a force on the 2A scene.

But in retrospect, we should have expected that result as the Rams rose steadily throughout the course of the year. If you want to explain the team's rise, look no further than the Aho brothers, Jack and Matt. Jack Aho is the defending cross country champ and the easy favorite to win again. His brother, Matt, improved immensely throughout the course of the season and is the fourth state returner. Do not rule out the possibility of a 1-2 team finish this year for the Aho brothers- the minuscule scores at the front make Grayslake Central so dangerous. Eli Minsky also returns this year to round out the best 1-2-3 punch in 2A.

Ray's Take: The Bulldogs ran as the favorites all year long until their pack got stretched out at Peoria, allowing Grayslake Central to win the championship. However, look for Mahomet-Seymour to give the state championship their best shot again, returning five of their top seven from the state runner-up squad and filling in the holes nicely with young runners. Andrew Walmer highlights the team, finishing 10th last year and returning as one of the few sub-15 runners in 2A. Brian Bucher's Richard Spring time of 15:05 makes him a strong second option, and he will hope to make up for a disappointing go at state in 2015. Gabe Pommier, Ben Craw, and Ryan Hodge were have experience running with the Bulldog pack in 2015 and return to give the Bulldogs their depth in 2016, and Riley Fortune, Bryson Keeble and Mathias Powell are the most likely candidates to run as the rest of the top seven. Keeble and Powell, sophomores, will also be the future of Mahomet-Seymour cross country.

#### The roundabout thoughts from boys editor Ray Lewis-

In these rankings, it is often difficult to compare the times on a screen and even the information that coaches give. Across the state, the consensus pick for the state champion is Grayslake Central, but in these rankings you see Mahomet-Seymour begin the year #1. This ranking is based on the returning strength of each team, and as we begin the year, Mahomet Seymour returns the most top to bottom of teams in the state. However, it would be a mistake to expect Grayslake will be anywhere other than in position to take the trophy home as well. The wonder of XC is that we do not have to wonder about the theoretical side of running- we can see how the season itself plays out!

November's rankings are the ones that matter.
