The History of Mahomet-Seymour Boys Cross Country

Mahomet-Seymour High School officially started the cross country program in the 1970-71 season.

Coach Merv Correll was the head coach for the team for two years before handing off the head coaching duties to Coach John King.

Coach John King was head coach from the 1973-74 season through the 2000-01 season. Coach King started the girls cross country program at our school during the 1981-82 season. John King was head coach of both programs until he retired after the 2000-01 season.

Coach Bonnie Moxley was head coach of both the boys and girls cross country team for one year in 2001-02 until the program was split into two separate programs with two separate head coaches. Bonnie Moxley has since been the head girls coach.

Neal Garrison has been head boys coach from the 2002-03 season through the current season.

Our program has been in existence for 49 years. In 2010, the Boys Cross Country team created the Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame in order to honor the coaches and runners that gave so much to our program.

In order to make it selective, we plan to only induct about 2 runners a year into the Hall of Fame after the initial induction ceremony.

Mahomet-Seymour was in the Sangamon Valley Conference to the 1975-76 season.

Mahomet-Seymour was in the Okaw Valley Conference from the 1976-77 season to the 1984-85 season.

Mahomet-Seymour was not in a conference during the 1985-86 season.

Mahomet-Seymour has been in the Cornbelt Conference from the 1986-87 season to the 2016-17 season.

Mahomet-Seymour has been in the Apollo Conference from the 2017-18 season to present.

Coach John King

Coach John King was a 2010 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Coach John King coached cross country at Mahomet-Seymour for 29 years. He also coached boys track and field during the majority of this time. He also was the junior high cross country coach for some of these years.

John began his coaching career using his running knowledge and passion for running to lead Mahomet-Seymour to be the best team in the area for decades. Coach King was the 2nd coach of 4 total head coaches for the history of Mahomet-Seymour cross country. His first year as head coach of the cross country team was the 1972 season. Coach King's final year was the 2000 cross country season.

Coach King coached the fastest runner in our school's history from 1970-2014 (Mark Johnson 14:41), the highest single A team place at State (4th in 1995 and 4th in 1996), a sectional championship team (1979), and eight regional championship teams (1976, 1978, 1979, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1995, and 1996).

Coach King was ahead of his time and had the first female runner on an all boys squad in 1974 (Jenny Johnson) and he created the first girls team in 1981. Coach King can be credited with be the foundation of the Mahomet-Seymour Cross Country program.


Coach King was also a strong cross country runner himself. He was a 2 time Vigo County champ, a 2 time Western Indiana Con. champ, and one various other invitational championships. He ran for Indiana State University where he broke the school record 3 times.

Coach Mery Correll

Coach Merv Correll was a 2010 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.


Coach Mery Correll coached cross country at Mahomet-Seymour for 2 years during the 1971 and 1972 seasons.

Mery was a standout basketball player in high school. He can still be found on some all-tournament team records for his accomplishments. Mery was a physical education teacher and driver education instructor at Mahomet-Seymour high school.

Mery also coached boys basketball during most of his teaching career. He was asked by the administration if he would be willing to coach cross country due to his coaching abilities.

Mery can be credited for being the first cross country coach for our program.

MR. MERV CORRELL conducted Driver Education courses. He was head varsity basketball coach and also coached cross country.

Jenny Johnson

Jenny was a 2010 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Jenny Johnson (now Jennifer Krueger) was the first female runner on an all boys squad in 1974. Just a few years earlier in 1967, Kathryn Switzer was tackled by the well respected Boston Marathon race director in an attempt to preserve the sanctity of the most prestigious marathon in the world by not allowing a female to run in it. In 1973, Title IX had just been passed to give females an equal opportunity in sports. However, in reality, girls sports still weren't treated equally.

Mahomet-Seymour and Jenny Johnson were ahead of the times. Jenny ran in 1974 and Mahomet-Seymour had their first all-girl's team in 1981. The Olympics wouldn't even let females run the marathon until 1984 and even then with much controversy. It would be hard to imagine the pressure of being the first female to join an all male sport's team.

Jenny demonstrated a tremendous amount of personal strength to break the barriers and to open up the doors for females in the sport. Jenny was quite a successful runner going on to qualify for state in track in the 1600 and 3200.

Jenny also helped break the barriers at the college level as she was on the first women's cross country team at Cleveland State University in 1980.

Mark Johnson

Mark was a 2010 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Mark ran in the 1973 and 1974 seasons.

Mark was captain of his team his senior year.

Mark was the most valuable runner for his team in both 1973 and 1974.

Mark holds the 5th highest "Most Dual Meet Wins for a Career" on the IHSA site with 36 wins from 1973-75. He also holds the 2nd highest "Most Dual Meet Wins for a Season" with 18 wins during the 1974 season. He also has the 2nd highest "Most Consecutive Dual Meet Wins in a Career" with 36 from 1973-1975. IHSA Records

Mark was All-Regional (top 5) both his junior and senior years. He placed 4th in 1973 and was the meet champion in 1974.

Mark was All-Sectional (top 10) both his junior and senior years. He placed 3rd in 1973 and 2nd in 1974.

Mark was a two time State qualifier. He qualified for State in 1973 and 1974.

Mark was All-State his senior year. He placed 13th in 1974.

Our school record was set at the Peoria course, which is the state meet course. We know this course is a true 3 mile course. Many of our courses are short or long. Our school record holder ran for Coach John King in the early 70's. He ran a time of 14:41. His record stood for almost 40 years.

Mark set our school record in the 1600 and 3200 in track. These two records are still some of the best ever in the area 40 years later.

Mark ran 4 years at the University of Wisconsin at Stevens Point. He made All-American in cross country his senior year as well as in track. He ran a 4:16 in the mile and 9:05 in the 2 mile in college.

Dan Nielsen

Dan was a 2010 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Dan ran during the 1987, 1988, 1989, and 1990 seasons.

Dan was captain of his cross country team his sophomore, junior, and senior years.

Dan was quite often a meet champion. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Clinton/Olympia triangular meet in 1989. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Catlin/Westville triangular meet in 1989. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Monticello/Argenta triangular meet in 1989. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Bloomington/Decatur triangular in 1990. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Prairie Central/Argenta triangular meet in 1988. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Pontiac/Olympia triangular meet in 1987. He won the Mahomet Seymour/SJO/Argenta triangular meet in 1989. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Uni High/Olympia triangular meet in 1988. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Urbana/Stephen Decatur triangular meet in 1989. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Uni High/Olympia/Prairie Central quadrangular meet in 1989. He won the Mahomet Seymour/Urbana/Stephen Decatur/Argenta/Prairie Central/Blue Ridge meet in 1990. He was the 1987 Chrisman Cowchip classic race #4 champion. He won the Peoria Woodruff Invitational in 1989. He won the Mahomet-Seymour Invitational in both 1989 and 1990. He won the Tuscola Invitational in 1990.

Dan was All-Conference all four years. He is one of only a few runners in the recorded history of our program that was able to accomplish this feat. He is also one of the only Mahomet-Seymour runner that won conference 2 years (1989 and 1990).

Dan was on the All-Regional (top 5) team all four years. He was a three time Regional champ (1988, 1989, and 1990). He is the only Mahomet-Seymour runner to win three Regional titles.

Dan was on the All-Sectional (top 10) team three years (1988, 1989, and 1990). He won the Sectional meet in 1990. He is one of the few runners in our team's history to be a Sectional champion.

Dan was a four time State qualifier (1987, 1988, 1989, and 1990). He was an All-State (top 25) runner 2 years. In 1988, he placed 22nd. In 1990, he placed 24th.

Dan's fastest 3 mile time was 15:03. He ran a 3.25 course in 16:03 which would have put him under 15:00 for 3 miles.

Dan ran a 9:31.7 in the 3200 and a 4:26.4 in the 1600 in track his senior year.

Dan went on to be a very competitive runner for 4 years at Illinois State University in both cross country and track. He earned all-conference honors at

Josh Mock

Josh was a 2011 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Josh ran during the 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998 seasons.

Josh was meet champion of the open race at the Conference meet as a freshman in 1995. He was the 1996 Chrisman Cowchip Classic #4 Race meet champion. He was the 1996 Mahomet Seymour/Urbana/Stephen Decatur triangular meet champion. He was the 1997 Mahomet Seymour/Urbana/Mt. Zion/Decatur St. Theresa quadrangular meet champion. He was the 1997 Tuscola Invitational meet champion.

Josh Mock was All-Conference (top 10) for 3 years. He placed 10th in 1996. He placed 5th in 1997. He placed 6th in 1998.

Josh was on the All-Regional (top 5) team in 1996 and 1998. He placed 2nd in 1996 and 5th in 1998.

Josh was on the All-Sectional (top 10) team in 1996, 1997, and 1998. He placed 10th in 1996. He placed 2nd in 1997. He placed 9th in 1998.

Josh was a four time State qualifier (1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998). He was an All-State (top 25) runner in 1996 when he placed 22nd. He was part of the teams that placed 4th in 1995 and 1996. He was in a unique time when Mahomet-Seymour went from being a larger single A school to one of the smallest AA schools in a two class system. Josh managed to compete well despite the jump in classes.

Josh has continued his running career running anything from the mile to ultra-marathon races.

Mark Wieneke

Mark was a 2011 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Mark ran on the team during the 1978, 1979, and 1980 seasons.

Mark was meet champion in the 1979 dual meet vs Monticello. He was also the meet champion in the 1979 dual meet vs Rautoul. He was the meet champion in the 1979 dual vs GRF. Mark also won the 1979 dual against Argenta.

Mark was on the All-Conference team in 1979. He placed third.

Mark was on the All-Regional (top 5) team in 1978 and 1980. He placed 3rd both years.

Mark was on the All-Sectional (top 10) team in 1978. He placed 7th.

Mark was a three time State qualifier (1978, 1979, an 1980). He was an All-State (top 25) runner 2 years. In 1978, he placed 25th. In 1980, he placed 17th. He is one of only a few runners in the history of our program to place at State more than one year in cross country.

He led his team at State in 1978, 1979, and 1980.

Mark ran three years at the University of Mexico and one year at the University of Illinois after high school.

Phil was a 2012 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Phil ran during the 1993, 1994, 1995, and 1996 seasons.

Phil was captain of his team his junior and senior years.

Phil was most improved runner of his team in 1994.

Phil was the 1995 Mahomet Seymour/U High/Prairie Central triangular meet champion. He was the 1995 Mahomet Seymour/Urbana/Stephen Decatur triangular meet champion.

Phil was All-Conference two years. He placed 5th in 1995 and 3rd in 1996.

Phil was on the All-Regional (top 5) team all two years. He place 8th in 1994, 4th in 1995, and 4th in 1996.

Phil was a three time State qualifier (1994, 1995, and 1996). He was an All-State (top 25) runner his junior and senior years. In 1995, he placed 22nd. In 1996, he placed 23rd.

Phil is only of only a few runners in the history of our program that have been an All-State cross country runner more than once.

Phil went on to continue his running career at Bradley University from 1997-2002 (including a red shirt season). He ran a 26:35 in the 8K during cross country, a 15:26 5K in track, and an impressive 3:59 1500.

Craig ran 4 years of cross country in 1975, 1976, 1977, and 1978.


Craig was a leader and captain of his team his junior and senior years.

Craig was All-Conference two years. He placed 6th in 1976. Craig was conference champion his junior year in 1977.

Craig was a leader on the teams that won conference year after year. His team won conference in 1976, 1977, and 1978.

Craig placed in the top 10 in the Regional his sophomore year with a 6th place finish.

Craig has continued his running after high school where he is well known for being an age group winner at most of the road races he runs in.

Neil Mathis

Neil was a 2012 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Neil ran during the 1982, 1983, and 1984 seasons.

Neil was captain of his team his senior year.

Neil was one of only two Mahomet-Seymour cross country runners ever to win the prestigious SJO Spartan Classic. He won it with a 14:54. Our program has only had a handful of runners ever break into the 14s in our 45 plus year program.

Neil won the #2 race at the 1983 Chrisman Classic. He was also the 1984 Mahomet-Seymour Invitational Champion. He won the 1984 triangular meet against SJO and Unity in 1984. He won the 1984 triangular meet against Monticello and Argenta.

Neil set many area course records. In 1984 he set the Mahomet-Seymour Invitational course record. He came back in his next meet to set Urbana's course record.

Neil was All-Conference all four years. He is one of only two runners in the history of our program that we have record of that accomplished this feat. He placed 9th in 1981, 7th in 1982, 3rd in 1983, and 1st in 1984. He was the Conference champion as a senior.

Neil was on the All-Regional (top 5) team all three years. He place 5th in 1982, 3rd in 1983, and 1st in 1984. He was the Regional champion his senior year.

Neil was on the All-Sectional (top 10) team three years. He placed 9th in 1982, 9th in 1983, and 3rd in 1984.

Neil was a two time State qualifier (1983 and 1984). He was an All-State (top 25) runner his senior year. In 1984, he placed 22nd. He is one of only a few runners in the history of the Mahomet-Seymour program that were an All-State cross country runners more than once.

Eric ran a 15:50 to place 8th at the SJO Spartan Classic in 1982.

Eric was All-Conference his junior and senior years. He placed 8th as a junior and he placed 5th as a senior. He helped his team win the conference meet in 1979 and 1980.

Eric was in the top 10 in the Regional meet his senior year.

Eric was a State qualifier. He placed 116th in 1980. He ran 4th for his team at State and helped them place 15th.

Karl was runner-up in the 1984 triangular meet against SJO and Oakwood. He was runner-up at the 1984 triangular meet against SJO and Unity.

Karl was runner-up at the 1984 SJO Spartan Classic with a 15:06.

Karl was meet champion in the #2 race at the 1984 Chrisman Classic.

Karl was meet champion in a triangular meet against Argenta and Monticello in 1984.

Karl was the most improved runner for our team for both the 1983 and 1984 seasons.

Karl was All-Conference his senior year. He placed 2nd behind his teammate.

Karl placed 10th in the Regional as a junior. He was on the All-Regional (top 5) team his senior year when he placed 2nd.

Kyle was a 2014 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Kyle ran during the 1998, 1999, 2000, and 2001 seasons for Mahomet-Seymour.

Kyle was captain of his team his junior and senior years.

Kyle was meet champion in the 1999 Chrisman Classic #2 race. He was meet champion of the 1999 Decatur/Bloomington triangular meet. He was the 1999 8 mile relay champion with Jordan Johnson at the U-High, Prairie Central, & Mahomet meet. He won the 1999 quadrangular meet with Tuscola, Heritage, and Villa Grove.

He was the meet champion of the 1999 & 2000 Tuscola Invitational. Kyle was the meet champion of the 2000 Mahomet-Seymour Invitational. He was also the two time conference champion in the 3200 meters in track.

Kyle was the most valuable runner as a senior.

Kyle was a four year letterman.

Kyle ran a 15:44 as a junior and a 15:20 at the SJO Spartan Classic as a senior.


Kyle was All-Conference his junior and senior years. He placed 4th as a junior. Kyle was conference champion his senior year in 2000.

Jordan ran during the 1998, 1999, and 2000 seasons for Mahomet-Seymour.

Jordan was captain of his team his junior year.

Jordan was the only Mahomet-Seymour runner to ever place in State in 6th, 7th, & 8th grades.

Jordan was State Champion his 8th grade year.

Jordan was the 1999 8 mile relay champion with Kyle Emkes at the U-High, Prairie Central, & Mahomet meet.

Jordan was the 2000 Chrisman Classic #4 runner meet champion.

Jordan won the SJO Spartan Classic as a junior with a 14:48.

Jordan placed 3rd in the Peoria Notre Dame Invitational as a junior with a 14:53.


Jordan was All-Conference his sophomore year. He placed 2nd as a sophomore.

Scott was a 2015 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Scott ran during the 1993, 1994, 1995, and 1996 seasons.

Scott was the meet champion in the 1993 dual meet against Blue Ridge. He was the 1993 Chrisman Cowchip classic #4 race meet champion. He was the meet champion in the 1994 dual meet against Prairie Central. He also was the meet champion in the 1994 Pontiac Fresh/Soph Invitational.

Scott ran in the 15s his sophomore, junior, and senior years. He ran a 15:40 his sophomore and senior seasons.

Scott was All-Conference his freshman, sophomore, and junior years. He placed 6th in 1993, 9th in 1994, and 9th in 1995.

Scott was in the top 10 of the Regional meet his freshman, sophomore, and junior years. He placed 4th in 1993, 10th in 1994, and 7th in 1995. Scott was All-Regional his freshman year as he placed in the top 5.

Scott was a State qualifier all four years. He is one of the only Mahomet-Seymour runners to accomplish this feat.

He placed 55th as a freshman, 27th as a sophomore, 86th as a junior, and 66th as a senior.

He was the fastest freshman in the State meet in 1993.

In fact, he was the only Mahomet-Seymour runner to qualify for State in cross country in 6th through 12th grade.

He helped his team to qualify for State for the first time in 5 years. He lead his team to a 10th place finish in 1994. He went on to help his team place 4th in both 1995 and 1996. This was the highest team finish ever for our program as a single A team.

Scott was a school record holder in XC for our junior high program.

Scott went on to run track for University of Indianapolis. He had a college best 8K time of 26:21 and 10K time of 33:51. He ran in the NCAA Division II National Championships as a senior.

Scott has continued his running career beyond college often winning races and even setting course records. He has run over 20 marathons and ultramarathons as well.

Jamie was a 2015 Mahomet-Seymour High School Boys Cross Country Hall of Fame Inductee.

Jamie ran during the 1985, 1986 and 1987 seasons.

Jamie was captain of his team his senior year.

Jamie was runner up in the dual meet against Monticello in 1986. He was also runner up in the 1986 Clinton Invitational.

Jamie was the meet champion of the 1986 dual meet with Tri-Valley. He was the meet champion of the 1986 triangular meet with Olympia and Unity. He was the meet champion of the 1986 triangular meet with Argenta and Monticello. He was the meet champion of the 1986 meet with Argenta and Prairie Central. He was the 1987 meet champion in a quadrangular with Decatur Eisenhower, Decatur Mac, and Urbana.


Jamie was All-Conference his senior year. He placed 9th as a senior.

Jamie was on the All-Regional (top 5) team his junior and senior years. He placed 2nd as a junior and 2nd as a senior.

Jamie was a State qualifier (1987). He placed 37th.

He helped lead his team to qualify for State for the first time in 7 years. He lead his team to a 10th place finish. This was the highest team finish our program had in our first 25 year history of the program.

This workout is run in honor of the Taylor Sebestik. Taylor was always a strong runner, but really set his mind to be the one of our greatest 800 and milers. Taylor had worked his way to being our top cross country runner as a senior. He ran in the 15's his senior year. Taylor was captain of his cross country team, most valuable runner, and the bulldog award winner his senior year. In the winter of Taylor's senior year, his running partner Robert Beach and him ran extremely tough workouts on the track. The pair would be seen sneaking into the indoor track late on weekend nights just to become the best runners they could be. Taylor determined that he would need to have an amazing 60 second or better last 400 in his race to be able to run the 800 and 1600 meter times that he hoped for. So after the most intense workouts when everyone was finished, Taylor decided that he always had to run a 60 second or better 400. Even after workouts that left everyone full of lactic acid and sick to the stomach you would see Taylor pick himself up and walk over to the starting line to run his gun lap 400. Taylor knew that he had to train both his mind and body to be able to dig down when he was at his most tired moment to run the final gun lap in 60 or better. Taylor would step on the line and run a painful gun lap 400. As a coach, it was both torture to watch and inspiring. Each week Taylor ran these his body and mind adapted. Soon most of the team would run the gun lap 400. In the end Taylor qualified for the indoor prep top times in the 1600 where he broke 4:30. 




